Chairman's Review for 2024

As the majority of members here at the AGM for the first time I think I need to explain fairly recent changes to how the Area Committee operates. The Area committee some years ago met four times each year to receive reports from groups, tackle any Somerset issues and represent Somerset at the General Council. The committee even published a regular newsletter.

In more recent years Groups have failed to attend these meetings or even send a report of Group activities. This lack of support for the Area plus a failure of members to replace the Area Posts of Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, Footpath or Membership Secretary has meant that just a few existing members in these posts volunteered to continue in these positions. We have for the past three years shared the post of Area Chair between the Groups Chairs so that Groups have the opportunity to become more involved.

The position of Chair passed to me from the Taunton Chair last year and today the Woodspring Chair Tony Smith has volunteered to take on the position of Area Chair this coming year. Other than to Chair last year's AGM and attend the General Council meeting on your behalf, I have done very little this year but the work of Area has continued thanks to Treasurer, Tony Dyson, Secretary Mike Plaskitt and especially Les Stather who has managed both Membership and Footpath Secretary very well.

The Area committee may not have run as it previously functioned but with very little support from the Groups more than the minimum has been achieved. Groups have received payments from the treasurer, and thanks to Les, Groups queries over membership have been answered and the Footpath Officers report clearly shows that the vital work of footpath protection has been effectively carried out in all of the Group areas.

Mike, Tony and Les have all volunteered to continue in these posts and to act on your behalf for another year. It would be good if we have members here today who would step up to replace them in a years' time and perhaps follow what is being done this year so that they can confidently take over next year. Over to you.

Somerset Ramblers Area Footpath Officer Report for AGM 2025

I would like to thank all the group footpath officers for their work dealing with footpath issues and diversions in their area.

As Area Footpath Officer, I have focused on working with the ramblers, Somerset Council and other users of the public right of way network such as The British Horse Society (BHS) and Trails Trust.

I have become a member of the Local Access Forum, who advise decision making organisations (such as local authorities) about making improvements to public access for outdoor recreation and sustainable travel.

Working with the BHS, we have forced Somerset Council to open T 2/11 in Bickenhall that has been closed for over 20 years. We had to threaten Somerset Council with legal action unless they opened it and they had to use the police in order to get access on to the land clear the obstructions.

Working with Brian Lucas, The Somerset Ramblers Don't Lose Your Way Coordinator, we have made significant progress with identifying rights of way that failed to get included on the definitive map and collecting the evidence required to submit an application to get them added. We are tackling this on a parish by parish basis. Thanks the work done by Ed Levy of Sedgemoor Ramblers and a ramblers volunteer, Susan Jones, we have identified all the paths on the 1910 map that are not on the current map. For each path we have identified the evidence we require and this is on order for copying from volunteers working at the National Archives in Kew. Once this has been received for a parish we will be able to identify the paths for which we have sufficient evidence. We will then share this with the parish council and ramblers members living in the parish to see if they know of any local evidence or if they can identify any paths that are not on the definitive map that are currently walked. This project was started because of the threat of a cut-off date in either 2026 or 2031. The government have recently announced their intention of abolishing the cut-off date. However an act of parliament needs to be passed to do this. I am producing a communication, to be sent to all Somerset MPs, explaining why they should support the government's intention to abolish the cut-off date.

Some observations over the last 4 years

1. Somerset's membership has reduced by 94 (6%). This compares to a growth of 26 (1%) in Avon
2. Those members not affiliated to a group have increased by 33 (43%). These are usually people who either do not walk in a group or do not want to be assigned to fixed group
3. No other group has increased its membership over this period
4. West Somerset's have had the steepest decline in members, reducing by 54 (31%). Sedgemoor's membership fell by 26 (20%), Mendip 29 (8%) and South Somerset 17 (7%)
5. The decline in membership in Mendip and South Somerset looks to have levelled off over the last year but West Somerset and Sedgemoor are still losing members.

Somerset Ramblers Area Footpath Officer Report for AGM 2026

I would like to thank all the group footpath officers for their work dealing with footpath issues and diversions in their area.

As Area Footpath Officer, I work with The Ramblers, Somerset Council and other users of the public right of way network such as The British Horse Society (BHS), Open Spaces and The Trails Trust.

I am a member of the Local Access Forum, which advises Somerset Council about making improvements to public access for outdoor recreation and sustainable travel.

I was asked to talk at Taunton Dean's AGM on the subject of how to use the law to improve access to rights of way. Subsequent to this I was asked to produce a process to help the public do this. I have done this and extended it to help parish councils and parish path liaison officers.

I have picked up some, long standing, access issues across the county and worked with parish councils to address these. Ongoing issues include Spaxton and East Pennard.

Working with Brian Lucas, The Somerset Ramblers Don't Lose Your Way Coordinator, we have made significant progress with identifying rights of way that failed to get included on the definitive map and collecting the evidence required to submit an application to get them added.

We are tackling this on a parish by parish basis. Thanks to the work done by Ed Levy of Sedgemoor Ramblers and a ramblers volunteer, Susan Jones, we have identified all the paths on the 1910 map that are not on the current map. For each path we have identified the evidence we require and this is on order for copying from volunteers working at the National Archives in Kew.

We have completed the research for 142 parishes and are in the process of sharing the results with the parish councils. We have identified the information we require from Kew for the remaining parishes and ordered these from the ramblers volunteer co-ordinator who liaises with the archives at Kew.

This project was started because of the threat of a cut-off date in either 2026 or 2031. The government announced, on Boxing Day last year, their intention of abolishing the cut-off date. However an act of parliament needs to be passed to do this. I have written to my MP for an update and have been assured that this will happen. However, given the previous track record of governments there can be no guarantee until the act is passed.

Once we have shared our research with the parish council we will be submitting Definitive Map Modification Orders. It is unlikely that these will be dealt with in my lifetime as the backlog is well over 20 years and growing. It is therefore essential that the applications are written to high standard so they can be picked up by someone else. We will be storing our application with The Ramblers in the hope that they are still around.

West Mendip Walkers have become a sub group of Mendip Ramblers

Mendip, Taunton Dean and Woodspring are showing about 5% reduction in membership

Sedgemoor and West Somerset are showing around 3 % increase
